Two New Treatment Programs To Ease Cravings, Help Pain Management

To help aid in the treatment and recovery process, Renz Center has recently added Medication-Assisted Treatment and a Positive Waves Group using Alpha-Stim devices as a part of its comprehensive Clinical Services treatment program.

Medication-Assisted Treatment

Medication-Assisted Treatment (MAT) is specific for individuals struggling with an alcohol and/or opiate use disorder, including heroin, Oxycontin,



Vicodin and other narcotic prescription drugs. When combined with evidence-based counseling practices, education, and medication, MAT is proven to be effective in substance use disorder treatment and aiding in the recovery process. The program incorporates several

different medications to tailor treatment needs to help reduce or eliminate cravings, alter brain response to mood altering substances, and reduce the risk of relapse.

"Medication-Assisted Treatment is a comprehensive outpatient alcohol and drug treatment program where medication helps reduce cravings so an individual can focus on positive change, abstinence, lifestyle changes, and long-term recovery," said Renz Center's Clinical Services Director Colleen Koncilja.

Positive Waves Group

To help alleviate pain, anxiety, depression and insomnia often associated with addiction, Renz Center now offers a Positive Waves Group using Alpha-Stim devices. Alpha-Stim is a small handheld device which uses low-level electrical current to safely and effectively treat pain, anxiety, depression, and insomnia. When combined with traditional therapy (individual counselling and support groups), the Positive Waves Group supports long-term recovery.

Alpha-Stim uses a (CES) technology which has existed for 40 years and has been regulated by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration since 1977. It has been used by over 8 million people worldwide and increasingly by the U.S. military for veterans who suffer from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

Alpha-Stim can also help clients with their addiction treatment goals by promoting greater focus and concentration. This means clients are better able to retain and process information, while being mentally present during treatment.

"Some of our clients have had back or knee surgery, for example, and notice that the posttreatment medication of hydrocodone has made them feel good or numb...helps them cope. This is where for some people the addiction begins. Over time people begin to need more and more, begin physician shopping, followed by getting prescription opioids from friends or family and then illicitly from others. This is a very common scenario and some of them end up using heroin," said Koncilja. "We also have clients with pain and anxiety issues. Initially they take opioids and benzodiazepines (benzos). . . a combination where the benzo enhances the high of the opiate. That, combined with mental illness, and

Opioid Overdose Education, Training Offered

Renz Center offers Opioid Overdose and Naloxone education and training that teaches:

- How to tell if someone is overdosing
- Calling 9-1-1 and the information they need
- Implementing emergency first aid
- Dispensing Naloxone, a medication that can reverse an overdose caused by an opioid drug

you have someone who is afraid of losing his or her drug/medication and being put back into severe pain and full blown anxiety."

can play a significant role in supporting those in recovery as they gain the independence, income and resources necessary to fully participate in society.

Journey To Recovery: Maria's Story

After getting arrested for drug possession, Maria was willing do whatever it took to stay out of jail. As a first offender, Maria was offered the Kane County's Deferred Prosecution Program, which meant having to complete a drug and alcohol assessment and following through with any recommendations.

When Maria first came to Renz Center, she did not think her marijuana use was problematic. Through counseling, Maria revealed she smoked marijuana to help ease anxiety and stress brought on by family obligations and an alcoholic father. After Maria's mother passed away in an accident, as an only sibling she felt compelled to care for her father after extended family turned him away due to his excessive drinking.

The Healing Process Begins

While reluctant at first, Maria finally decided her marijuana use was contributing to her unhappiness. She embraced the idea of recovery and leading a healthier lifestyle. She began to make changes by finding a healthier job and parting with friends who were a poor influence.

Through the Center's outpatient program, Maria began to understand how she was self-medicating her depression and anxiety with marijuana. She had spent years caring for her father and neglecting herself. Only when abstinent, did Maria realize her relationship with her father was unhealthy. Through individual and group sessions, Maria learned how to better care for herself and her father. She established healthy boundaries with her father through appropriate detachment...caring instead of caretaking, and forcing him to deal with the consequences of his actions. Maria learned that by owning her addiction and not enabling others, she was a happier, healthier person. Through group sessions, Maria also was able to connect with other people in

similar circumstances...she realized she was not the only one in the room who felt lonely, embarrassed about her arrest, and her codependency with her father.

Healthy, Sober Living

When Maria completed treatment at Renz, she had obtained 8 months of

sobriety and was attending 12-step meetings for support. She had a healthier relationship with her father and boyfriend, and made new friends she could rely on for support. Today, Maria continues with abstinence. She has a great job, enrolled in college, and has finally found the confidence she had been lacking most of her life.
